The 2022/2023 school year is coming to an end - so it's time to sum up the project "Our cultural heritage and youth" aimed at students of Secondary School No II in Kępno.

The project was approved for implementation in August 2020, however, due to the situation related to the global pandemic, we started all activities in the 2021/22 school year.

It is cofinanced by the European Union, and all partner schools received a total of EUR 190,860.00 for its implementation. The project started on September 1, 2020 and ended on August 31, 2023. It was joined by 6 partner schools from Greece, Romania, Turkey, Portugal, Croatia and Poland. Secondary School No II in Kepno was the applicant for the project and it coordinator.

Work on the project was multi-stage. It was two years of hard but very fruitful work in each of the schools. Thanks to the involvement of students and teachers, many valuable materials have been created that can be successfully used as teaching aids. These are e.g. presentations, films, albums, artwork, and lots of photos. Undoubtedly, the biggest attraction of the project were foreign exchanges of school children and teaching staff. During these two years together, project participants had a unique opportunity not only to meet teachers and students from partner schools, but also to get acquainted with educational systems from different parts of Europe. They also saw the most beautiful corners of regions and cities where partner schools are located. Through direct and e-mail contacts with peers from other countries, students not only improved their language skills, but also made interesting acquaintances and even lasting friendships. Thanks to them, they had the opportunity to get to know the culture and lifestyle in the partner countries, exchange views, break down barriers and overthrow national stereotypes and prejudices.

Participation in the project allowed teachers to enrich their work by exchanging experiences, observing classes in foreign schools and learning about interesting forms of working with young people. For all participants of the project, it was certainly two years of extraordinary experiences and unforgettable impressions.

As a project coordinator, I am grateful to all people involved in the project, both from Poland and from partner countries, for their cooperation, help and kind words. I am convinced that the friendship that has formed between us will last for a long time. It is thanks to you that the project was carried out in a great atmosphere, which was felt already at the first meeting of the coordinators. Presentation of partner towns Poland - Kępno

- A county town located on the Niesób River (commonly known as Samica) in the Wieruszów Upland. Kępno is the southernmost city in the Wielkopolskie Voivodeship, 170 km from Poznań and 63 km from Kalisz.
- Kępno is a city of many cultures, attracting with historical flavors, with traces of settlement from the Bronze Age. It is located at the junction of communication routes and boasts the largest after Poznań Wielkopolska market. Thanks to him, trade flourished here. The spatial layout of the city dates back to the Middle Ages. A visit to Kępno is a journey through time, a journey through three faiths, other cultures that coexisted and complemented each other, creating one efficiently functioning organism. This small town has incredible potential.













Turkey - Eskişehir

- Eskişehir is one of the modern cities of the country with three universities and many art institutions. Almost I million people live in Eskişehir and it's located in Central Anatolia Region of Turkey. It is a city developed in arts and culture with its art institutions and facilities. The city has also the titles of the Turkish World Capital of Culture and the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage Capital. On the other hand, according to the UN report Eskişehir is the second best livable city in Turkey. Eskişehir is also one of the leading cities in Turkey in terms of socio-economic development.
- Eskişehir has survived under different civilizations until today. However, Eskişehir is a touristic center that attracts attention with many historic and natural places to visit like Odunpazarı. Otherwise, there are a lot of historical places to visit in the city like mosques, castles and museums. The city is also famous for meerschaum. The region also has important reserves in terms of boron mine. If we look at the education perspective, Eskişehir has the one of the universities with the highest number of students of the country such as Anadolu University. The city looks like a student city.





Portugal - Braga

- Braga is a city of huge beauty and heritage richness, which combines tradition with innovation, the memory to the youth, creativity to conservatism.
- With over 2000 years of a very rich history, possesses one of the oldest Sacro-Montes in Europe and is the representative of the Minho region, the Bom Jesus. In Braga, we can find the oldest Portuguese Cathedral and the Motherhouse of the Benedictines, the Monastery of Tibães (Mosteiro de Tibães).
- Braga presents places that by their intrinsic devotion and beauty, impose themselves as
 mandatory benchmarks to visit. The Sanctuary of Sameiro (Santuário do Sameiro), the
 Bom Jesus and the Falperra, settling on an appealing religious basis, are surrounded by
 ravishing green spaces and paradise landscapes.
- The Roman legacy is another of the attractive factors of Braga, often called 'Portuguese Rome', due to its origin in the Roman city of Bracara Augusta. Known by its distinct churches, splendid XVIII century houses, gardens, nature parks and recreational areas. Braga's long history is visible in the splendor of its monuments, museums and churches.
- Visiting Braga is like taking a time travel inside modernity. Old city and of traditional religiousness always imposing on its richness and majesty lives hand in hand with the
 entrepreneurship and young spirit in vital areas such as culture, commerce, gastronomy,
 industry and services.









Romania - Borşa

- Borşa is a town in eastern Maramureş County, in the valley of the river Vişeu and near the Prislop Pass. Linking Transylvania to Bukovina, Prislop Pass is surrounded by the Rodna and Maramureş Mountains, both ranges of the Carpathians. The highest peak in the region is Pietrosul Rodnei — 2,303 meters.
- There is a health resort in the city, as well as a winter sports center, the total length of alpine skiing trails is nearly 6 km. The timber industry developed in the town. The Rodna Mountains National Park is also located near Borşa.











Greece - Rethymno

- Rethymno is a city in Greece on the island of Crete. It is the capital of Rethymno regional unit, and has a population of more than 30,000 inhabitants (near 40,000 for the municipal unit). Rethymno is a beautiful Cretan city, one of the largest on the entire island. The village is situated on a small cape along a coastline of 13 kilometers. A great variety of Rethymno are the small hills rising to the south, which add even more charm to the city's panorama.
- Rethymno was originally built during the Minoan civilization (ancient Rhithymna and Arsinoe). The city was prominent enough to mint its own coins and maintain urban growth. One of these coins is today depicted as the crest of the town: two dolphins in a circle.
- All of Crete has been occupied by various occupiers over the years, which is perfectly visible in the city's architecture. In Rethymno, typically European art is mixed with oriental art from the times of dominance on the island by the Ottoman Empire.











Croatia - Donja Pušća

Pušća is a municipality in Zagreb County in Croatia. According to the 2011 census, 2,700 people live in Pušća, 97 percent of which are Croats. The municipality covers an area of 18.20 square kilometers and forms part of the Zaprešić metropolitan area.











Presentation of schools Zespół Szkół Ponadpodstawowych no I in Kępno

The applicant organization is Liceum Ogólnoksztalcące no II in Zespół Szkół
Ponadpodstawowych no I in Kępno. Students educate in classes with the extended
subjects: maths, English, It and Biology-chemistry. Apart from high school there are
also technical classes where students educate in different directions - environment
protection, IT, landscape architecture, car mechanics, economics, advertisement,
gastronomy. There are about 950 students and 80 teachers.











Turkey - MUSTAFA KEMAL ATATÜRK MESLEKİ VE TEKNİK ANADOLU LİSESİ

- Our school is a state high school.
- Our students receive four-year theoretical and practical training in the field of health care, midwife assistantship, nursing assistant and healthcare technician. Our school is a vocational and technical secondary school providing education to 622 students.
- Our students have the opportunity to have vocational higher education in their fields. Students are given theoretical and practical training within the school, and under the coordination of their teachers in public and private institutions.









Portugal - Carlos Amarante School Group (AECA)

- It has about 3300 students and is composed of fourteen schools, from pre-school to secondary education, including adult education.
- Vocational courses, at the secondary level, are in the areas of Electronics, Metalworking, Computer Science, Design and Sports. These courses are certified by the Centre for Qualification and Vocational Education.
- The school has a long history of training for the local labour market and its genesis is marked by this experience.
- The other secondary courses are in the area of Sciences and Technologies, Arts, Economics and Languages.









Romania - Liceul Borşa

• Borsa High Shool is an urban high school of regional interest, theoretical, technical and vocational at the same time. It has 1387 pupils aged between 10 and 19 and 67 teachers. It was founded in 1967 and it has the highest number of students in our county. In our high school there are two forms of education, middle high school and high school. In middle high school we have a class at each level: 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th. Curriculum in high school includes Theoretical programs, Services and Economic programs and Technical programs. The Theoretical programs include: Science ("Mathemathics and Computer Studies" and "Earth Studies") and Humanities ("Philology" and "Social Studies"). Services and Economic programs include "Economics" and "Tourism" and Technical programs include "Mechanics". Vocational programs with a duration of three years offer two types of qualification: "Mechanic" and "Waiter/Cook/Seller in food units".









Greece - 2nd Junior High School of Rethymno

Our school is located in Rethymno on the north coast of Crete and it was founded in 1983. It is the largest Secondary School of the Prefecture and approximately accommodates 450 students - aged 13 to 15 years old - of the three grades in eighteen medium sized classes. Our faculty consists of 25 permanent teachers and about 15 seasonal. Special classes are held for pupils with special needs. Furthermore, remedial teaching classes are held too. We take pride in our welcoming environment and in the sense of community engendered by a spirit of cooperation among staff, students, and parents.











Croatia - Osnovna Skola Pušća

• OŠ Pušća (Primary School Pušća) is a state school situated in Donja Pušća, a village near Zagreb, the capital of Croatia. It's a primary public school for pupils 6 to 15 years old. All together we have 329 students and 52 teachers. It is one of the oldest schools in western part of Zagreb County. It was found in 1848.











The aims of the Project
